


Studio workshop: Animation

A studio based workshop led by Zoe Josephine Payne

Summary:

This workshop led by Zoe Josephine Payne, will take participants through the creative processes involved in creating a unique short collage animation using iPads. The workshop will explore style, imagery, line and composition through drawing activities in the Japan gallery before using this imagery to create three unique collage motifs that will form the basis of a transformative animation.

At the end of the workshop each participant will have a short collage animation that has imaginatively dealt with idea of transformations and shifting rhythms in response to Japanese art. Students will each have a body of preparatory research drawings, movement drawings and rhythmic pattern drawings and collages that have informed their film.

Information about Zoe Josephine Payne:

Zoe Josephine is an artist and set designer using film to explore ideas of surface and boundaries between the internal and external. Zoe Josephine's wider practise combines performance, drawing, installation and collage and brings together disparate elements and refigures them in new contexts, playing with ideas of liveness and the present.
