Before you visit:

Planning what to see

We hope that the schools brochure has helped you decide what to see and do when you visit with your class. For upto-date information, please see www.vam.ac.uk or call 020 7942 2000 near the time of your visit.

Booking a visit

All school visits, including self-guided, must be pre-booked on o2o 7942 2000. Three weeks' notice is required for facilitated sessions, two weeks for self-guided visits. Please note that we will require billing information for all sessions, free and charged, when making a booking.

Changes and cancellations

Call 020 792 2000 as soon as possible if you need to change or cancel your visit, or anticipate being late for a workshop or tour. Sessions cancelled within three weeks of the visit will be liable to the full cost of the session. For free 1-hour sessions, there is a £60 charge per session if cancelled within three weeks. For free 90-minute sessions there is a charge of £110 per session if cancelled within three weeks. Free workshops and projects will be charged at £250. Teacher/student ratio

Foundation Stage: 1 adult to 3 students
Key Stage 1 & 2: 1 adult to 6 students
Key Stage 3, 4, & 5: 1 adult to 15 students
We cannot lead workshops or tours without a
teacher present. Self-guided groups should have
adult supervision at all times and students are
not permitted in galleries unaccompanied.

Access

Arriving at the V&A

Please enter through The Sackler Courtyard Entrance or the Tunnel Entrance from South Kensington Underground station, and follow signage to the Sackler Centre.

In the interest of visitor safety, our Security team carry out bag searches at the entrances to the Museum.

If you have booked a facilitated session, please register at the Sackler Centre Reception 20 minutes before the start of the session to allow time for students to use the cloakrooms and toilets

Facilities for schools and colleges

There are lockers for schools in the Sackler Centre to leave coats and bags. Please request one at the Sackler Centre Reception Desk. Lockers cannot be guaranteed unless a lunchroom space has been booked.

The lunchroom is available in half-hour slots. Please ask for a slot when you make your booking. When using the lunchroom please leave it clean and tidy.

Conduct

Please remind your group not to touch objects, shout or run while in the V&A. However, do look out for the hands-on symbol in the galleries indicating special objects which can be touched:



Drawing should be with coloured or graphite pencils only and must be encased in a box or bag. Please note: sketching may be restricted in certain temporary exhibitions. Please check the website for details.

Opening times

10.00-17.45 daily 10.00-22.00 Every Friday (selected galleries remain open after 17.45). Closed 24-26 December.

Admission

Admission to the V&A is free. A separate charge may apply for some special exhibitions and events.

Exhibition admission

There is a concessionary ticket price for school students and teachers who book in advance as a group. All bookings are timed entry. Tickets for self-guided exhibition visits must be paid for 48 hours prior to visiting. Tickets can only be issued once payment has been processed.
