Arranged by key styles and movements, the course features a wide range of case study homes that form the backbone of the eight lectures. These exemplars are discussed in some detail as a way of exploring vital strands and themes within the overall narrative of 20th century interior design.

Beginning with Neo-Classicism and Arts & Crafts, the story moves through the Art Deco and Art Nouveau period before charting the advance of early modernist interiors, mid-century style and onwards through the design strands of the final decades of last century, with themes including minimalism, maximalism and the new American style. Featured designers include John Stefanidis, Andrée Putman, Rose Tarlow, Sills Huniford, Jacques Garcia and David Mlinaric.
