The Ceramic Staircase, completed in 1869, is one of the most elaborately decorated parts of the V&A's Victorian buildings. This detail of its ceiling shows painted panels fired onto hexagonal tiles. The shape was a new innovation at the time, much easier to apply to curved surfaces than square tiles.
