Overview

Explore the history of European art from a unique perspective – the V&A's remarkable collection of paintings. Drawing examples from the Renaissance to the early 20th century, expert lecturers uncover the stories paintings tell. Paintings perform so many functions. They can entertain, delight and shock us, or communicate ideas of status and power, describe relationships between individuals and cultures, record appearances, reflect aesthetic ideals or systems of belief. These functions change over time, so that a single work may be the starting point for many stories – from the ambitions of the artist who created it in the 16th century to the priorities of a modern museum collection.

Your course leader

Kathy graduated at Oxford University and the Courtauld Institute. In 2001 she completed a PhD thesis on French painters in Rome during the 19th century. A lecturer specialising in 19th-century art history, she is currently a course director at the V&A, where she organises courses and study days on the history of art and design.
