15-minute performances at 19:45 and 21:00

Immerse yourself in Josie Man's musical world celebrating self-love, strength and the transformative power of healing. Through the performances, the singer looks at the impact of modern beauty standards on us, advocating us to rewire these patterns.

Described as 'identity pop', her music embraces fluidity and authenticity, allowing fusions of sounds, moods and influences. Explore her Y2K-influenced collage of images on screen.

## **Big Pink Angel**

Sculpture, Room 24, The Dorothy and Michael Hintze Gallery and Room 25 Drop in from 18:30–21:30

DaddyBears shiny squishy textile sculptures sit alongside an installation unique to the V&A. Found furniture and toys are manipulated using the artist's own upholstery technique, rendering each object unrecognisable to its former life.

The re-imagining of process and form continues through to a giant textile rendering of a quilted pink satin angel. Big Pink Angel dangles from the V&A's banisters, strapped up by her own ribbons. She's covered in quilted imagery reflecting her time wandering the collections. DaddyBears has used various embroidery, applique and quilting techniques inspired by those of which were taught to schoolgirls of the 17th centurythe artist's take on these techniques is a modernised version used to illustrate a childlike naivety in her visual language.
