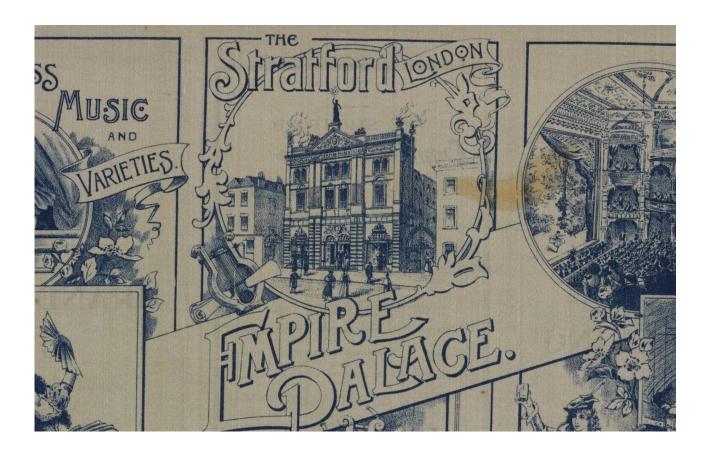
SPITALFIELDS WALKING **TOUR: IMMIGRATION** AND **CREATIVITY**

This walk will explore Spitalfields, one of London's most famous quarters. A place of settlement of migrants and site of production of the world-famous silks, seen in the V&A's textile collections, Spitalfields has been defined by the cultures of Huguenots, Jewish, Irish, Bangladeshi and other communities over four centuries.

This walking tour will be taking place on Friday 20 February and 13 March 2026.
