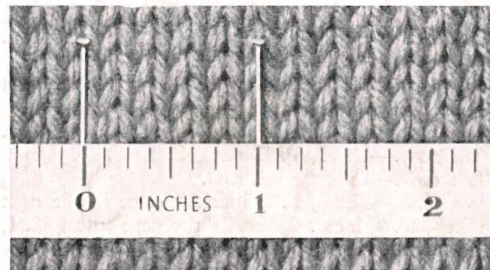


SCARF—See Fig. D.

MATERIALS:—13 ozs. PATONS ROSE, or WHITE HEATHER, Fingering, 4-ply. Four No. 6 "BEEHIVE" Knitting Needles, with points at both ends, measured by the Beehive gauge.

ACTUAL MEASUREMENTS:—Length, 48 ins. Width, $9\frac{1}{2}$ ins.

TENSION:—5 stitches to the inch in width (not stretched) must be obtained to give a garment of the above-mentioned size. If, using the needles recommended, more than 5 stitches to the inch are obtained, needles a size coarser should be tried; if less than 5 stitches, then a size finer. Whatever the size of needles found suitable by the Knitter, it is absolutely essential that the fabric should measure 5 stitches to the inch.

RECIPE:—Using two strands of wool together throughout, cast on 90 stitches, 30 on each of three needles.

1st round.—Knit plain.

Repeat this round until the work measures 48 inches. Cast off.

With a damp cloth and hot iron press carefully.

THE FRINGE.—Wind the wool round a piece of cardboard 2 inches wide and cut through one edge. Taking 8 strands together, double them and using a crochet hook, draw a loop through the double edge of the Scarf, pass the ends through the loop and knot firmly. Repeat at even distances along the ends of the Scarf.
