Introduction

Chart the dramatic changes of this turbulent period which witnessed the Textiles are very fragile and even the most sturdy is vulnerable to wear and tear, to damage by insects, by dampness, even by the light we need to see them. They are often fabrics of great beauty but under normal circumstances they do not last. In the modern world textiles are seen as transient accessories to our life and are relatively inexpensive to replace, but throughout history textiles have been the most obvious expression of our personal values. Lustrous silk, crisp linen, soft wool and brightly coloured cotton clothe our bodies and decorate our homes. They are *the* most intimate form of all the decorative arts, but how well do we know them?

In this course you will discover where historical textiles have survived and will become familiar with the materials and techniques used to produce an infinite variety of fabrics and patterns, from enormous tapestries and carpets to gossamer-like webs of lace, from glittering embroidery to muted tweeds.
