

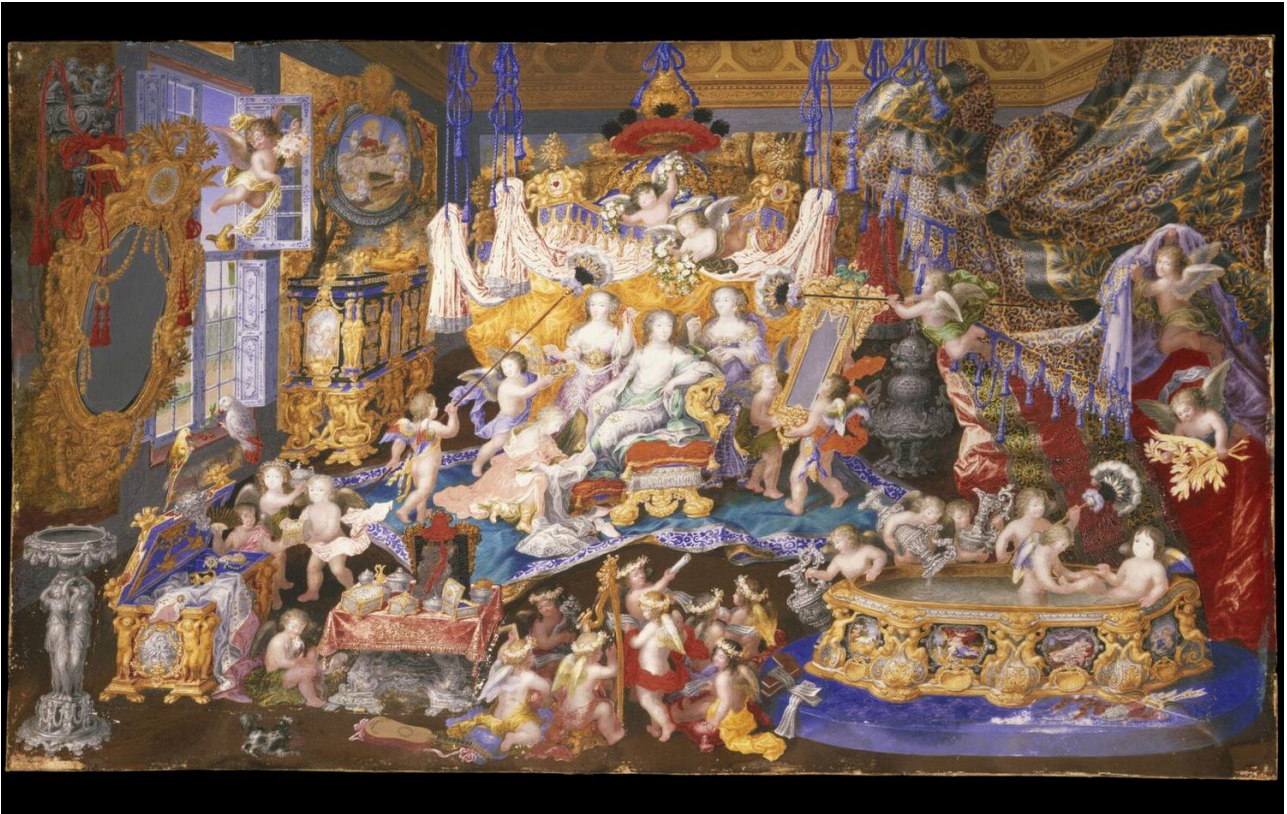

Introduction

Explore a remarkable period in the history of art. Expert lecturers will bring to life key changes in art and design during the late 17th and 18th centuries and show how a growing art market reshaped relationships between artists, patrons and audiences.

The art world during the early modern period was remarkable for its stylistic diversity, from the grandeur of French Baroque to the exuberance of Italian Rococo. By the end of the eighteenth century a reaction against the Rococo, fuelled by social and political developments but given further impetus by archaeological discoveries, prompted a return to classical restraint in the form of Neoclassicism. Throughout Europe, increasing wealth, together with better opportunities for travel, widened the art market beyond the traditional spheres of church and state. Drawing on the V&A's collections, expert lecturers will trace stylistic developments within a wider political and cultural context, and in relation to wider themes such as taste, patronage and the art market.

Guest Lecturers include Caroline Knight, architectural historian specialising in English sixteenth and seventeenth century architecture and patronage; Clare Ford-Wille, independent art historian, lecturer for the National Gallery, the V&A and the Arts Society.
